

The UO's College of Education is a national leader in shaping futures. With tools used in over 29,000 schools, our research transforms classrooms across the country. The HEDCO Institute brings groundbreaking educational strategies to teachers, ensuring that Oregon's youngest learners—and learners across the nation—have the support they need to succeed from day one.

### Youth Behavioral & Mental Health

The UO is addressing the youth mental health crisis head-on. At the Ballmer Institute and the Prevention Science Institute, we combine research with real-world applications to support young Oregonians. By embedding resources in schools and working directly with families, we're strengthening the state's mental health foundation, so every child has the support they need to thrive.

### Community Service

Our commitment to Oregon's communities is woven into everything we do. Through the Sustainable City Year Program, the UO tackles community challenges with sustainable solutions, while the RARE Program brings expertise to rural areas to support economic development. From cities to small towns, the UO is a partner in creating resilient, thriving communities that prosper together.

#### **Environmental Resilience**

In a state defined by natural beauty, the UO is working to keep Oregon's landscapes—and its communities—resilient. The Oregon Hazards Lab powers ShakeAlert with 220 seismic monitoring stations and helps first responders track wildfires through a network of cameras statewide, while the Oregon Institute of Marine Biology works to study and preserve the state's coastal ecosystems. Through these efforts and many others, the UO is ensuring Oregon's environmental legacy endures.

### **Human Performance & Sport**

The UO is redefining human performance to benefit health and community. The Bowerman Sports Science Center brings cutting-edge discoveries to the community, creating tools and techniques that drive wellness, resilience, and human potential.

### Workforce Development

Oregon's workforce depends on
UO graduates, ready to step into
industries across the state. According to
the UO's 2022-23 First Destination
Survey, 98% of 2023 graduates who
responded 6-12 months after graduation
reported being employed, pursuing
further education, or engaged in service
programs (e.g., Peace Corps). With strong
industry partnerships and skills-focused
programs, we're ensuring Oregon has the
talent it needs to compete and grow.
