- **Expand eligibility** to include students with a Student Aid Index (SAI) up to 10,000, ensuring more low- and middle-income students can access this critical resource.
- **Increase award amounts** to address rising costs of tuition and living expenses, providing meaningful support to more Oregon students.
- **Help more students graduate** by reducing financial barriers, improving retention, and reducing student debt.

What is the OOG?

The Oregon Opportunity Grant (OOG) is Oregon's largest need-based financial aid program for postsecondary students, helping them afford tuition, books, and other essential expenses while pursuing their degrees. The program currently provides vital financial support to over 30,000 Oregon residents pursuing their first associate or bachelor's degree at public universities, community colleges, and private colleges and universities across the state.

For many Oregonians, financial aid is the key to accessing higher education and building a better future. The OOG is a critical resource for students as they overcome financial barriers and pursue degrees that lead to higher-paying jobs, career advancement, and long-term financial stability.

Impact of the OOG

- By 2031, 72% of jobs in the U.S. are projected to require at least some postsecondary education. The OOG has a successful history of improving access to higher education for lower-income students, expanding their ability to pursue the degrees needed to fill these critical roles and contribute to the state's economic success.
- The OOG is empowering students to access higher education and stay on track to graduate. Students who receive the OOG consistently match or outperform their higher-income peers in key measures such as retention and credit completion.
