
TOP COUNTIES WHERE UO SPENDS MONEY WITH BUSINESSES OVER FIVE YEARS



UO scholarships, grants, and institutional, federal and state financial aid play a key role in efforts to promote academic excellence, giving talented and driven Oregonians the means to ascend to the top of their chosen fields.

JUST SOME OF THE MANY INSTITUTIONAL SCHOLARSHIPS AWARDED TO STUDENTS BY THE UO INCLUDE:

- PathwayOregon: This program ensures that academically qualified, Pell Grant-eligible Oregonians will have their tuition and fees paid through a combination of federal, state, and university funds. It also provides comprehensive academic support and career guidance.
- Summit and Apex Scholarships: These \$24,000 and \$12,000 scholarships, respectively, are granted over four years to incoming Oregon freshmen based on GPA (Summit 3.80, Apex 3.60) and test scores. Recipients may combine this award with other UO scholarships.
- Diversity Excellence Scholarship: Awarded to students who, through sharing their varied cultural perspectives, will enhance the education of all UO students and the excellence of the UO. The annual award is \$6,500 for undergraduates and \$9,000 for graduate students.
