- 1) Call the Eugene Police Department nonemergency number (541-682-5111) to report the illegal behavior. Even if EPD does not have time to respond, this documents the incident and our office receives basic details, including the time of call, whether EPD responded, and what actions were taken.
- 2) Provide details of the incident, including location, time, and an explanation of illegal behaviors and impact to the UO using the goodneighbor@uoregon.edu email. This email goes directly to staff with UO Community Relations, the UO Police Department, and the Office of the Dean of Students.

Opportunity to provide feedback on new UO long-range transportation plan

University of Oregon Transportation Services has been working with a transportation consultant team to develop a long-range Transportation Plan for the Eugene campus.

The UO Transportation Plan will be a comprehensive long-term strategy aimed at enhancing accessibility, fostering campus vibrancy, and balancing sustainable travel options including walking, biking, and transit use with campus parking needs. The goal is to support safe and efficient travel needs while effectively coordinating development efforts with the surrounding community and supporting campus sustainability goals.

The plan will provide the university with a long-range transportation capital project list, including both likely and aspirational projects, and a plan that supports multimodal connectivity, pedestrian safety, a bike-friendly campus, transit enhancements, campus green initiatives and parking management.

The UO values our campus neighbors, and the planning process includes opportunities to gather input, feedback, and your ideas. All interested neighbors are invited to a presentation by UO Transportation Services staff, at which they will present current findings and recommendations to neighborhood residents and hear feedback from the community that will inform revisions to the final plan:

- To receive summer only alerts for the Eugene campus, use code UOSummer.

UO students and employees who have signed up through DuckWeb should not sign up via text, as they will receive the same message twice.

NEXT GENERATION HOUSING

Over the next 20 years, the University of Oregon is planning more high-quality, learning-centered residential communities on campus that are compatible with surrounding neighborhoods, provide a gentle transition between higher and lower intensity uses, and serve our growing student community.

To plan a variety of housing types that meet the needs of first-year students, undergraduates, graduates, and families, the UO is in the process of designing two 800-bed residence halls that will be built on the southeast side of campus between 17th and 19th Avenue and Moss and Villard Streets.

The first residence hall is scheduled for completion by fall 2027, and the second residence hall is scheduled for completion by fall 2028.

Code Amendment, Refinement Plan Amendment, and Zone Change: The application for a code amendment, refinement plan amendment, and zone change was submitted to the City of Eugene on March 21. Hearings for the proposed land use changes are expected to come before the City of Eugene Planning Commission and City Council in fall 2025.

Prep for Next Generation Housing Phase 1 Residence Hall

- Construction of residence hall will be completed summer 2027
- Future location south of 17th Avenue between Columbia and Moss streets (<u>map</u> - also available at <u>gcr.uoregon.edu/next-generation-housing</u>)

On Monday, June 9, the process of abatement (asbestos removal) and removal of UO-owned houses began and will continue through July 31. The following dwellings are being abated and removed:

1704 E. 17th Ave. • 1706 E. 17th Ave. • 1744 E. 17th Ave. 1739 A/B Moss St. • 1744 Moss St. • 1724 Moss St. 1736 A/B Moss St. • 1802 Moss St.

Expect fencing around dwellings, removal and boarding up of windows, and work inside houses. Professional abatement and demolition is being completed by All Aspects Environmental and Demolition, and the process is being monitored by UO Environmental Health and Safety.

Additionally, a half-block of Columbia Street, from 17th Avenue to just north of the UO Central Kitchen, will be closed for utility improvements in the right-of-way between July 15 and early August. Improvements include a new sanitary line and storm line from 17th Ave to the existing sanitary line in Moss Alley.

Hours of work are 7 am – 5 pm, Monday through Friday.

CONSTRUCTION CORNER

Knight Campus Building 2

Riverfront Parkway and Millrace Drive

Exterior building façade installation is nearing completion. Installation of interior drywall, ceilings, interior finishes, and building systems is underway on all levels. The Knight Campus Building 1 north entrance and pedestrian boardwalk between Building 1 and Millrace are closed during the construction of a skybridge connecting Buildings 1 and 2. Riverfront Parkway remains open in all directions with occasional construction traffic. Completion is on schedule for winter 2026.

Demolition of Hamilton Residence Hall Complex

Corner of E. 13th and Agate St.

The Hamilton complex of residence halls will be removed and replaced with green space and an outdoor beach volleyball court, which will be used by the UO Women's Beach Volleyball team. Project completion is expected by late July 2026.

Fencing will go up in mid-July 2025. The sidewalk on the north side of the project along 13th Ave. will be closed, while the sidewalk on the west side near Agate St. will remain open. Salvage operations are underway and will continue through July 2025, at which point the project will transition to abatement. Demolition will begin in November.

Villard and University Halls "Heritage" Renovation Project

W. 11th near Franklin Blvd

The UO's two oldest buildings are undergoing complete interior renovations and exterior restorations. Completion is on schedule for fall 2025.

UO Athletics Indoor Practice Facility

Leo Harris Parkway

As construction of a new philanthropically-funded athletics practice facility west of Autzen Stadium begins, a portion of Leo Harris Parkway is being realigned. The west end of Leo Harris Parkway is temporarily closed to all traffic between MLK Blvd. and the new Eugene Science Center parking lot west of the footbridge to Alton Baker Park from late December 2024 through summer 2025. Access to UO Athletics facilities, the Eugene Science Center, and Alton Baker Park is available from the east end of Leo Harris Parkway. The new parking lot adjacent to Eugene Science Center remains open. Construction of the new practice facility will be completed in 2026.
